

A process and timetable for completing the new EarthScope Science Plan by January 31, 2010

October 7–8 – WESP meeting – Snowbird UT.

October 9 – Writing team and editorial committee meet to outline report and assign sections.

October 19 – Discussion at **Geological Society of America National Meeting – EarthScope Town Hall** meeting – 6 pm in the Oregon Convention Center Room D137/138. Mike Williams, Anne Trehu and Bob Lillie will be present to discuss the workshop and the process for completing the plan.

October 23 – Writing team turns in assignments to the editorial committee.

November 9 – First draft circulated to workshop participants and ESSC with comments due by Nov. 23.

November 23–December 2 – Writing team and editorial committee incorporate comments.

December 2 –December 7 – Draft formatted by GEOPROSE.

December 9 – Draft released to the community for comments via WEB download. The community will be informed of this opportunity via the EarthScope, IRIS, UNAVCO, SSEC and other email listserves.

December 14–18 – Discussion at **AGU**. The Science Plan will be the focus topic for discussion at the **EarthScope Town Hall** meeting (Time and Place TBD).

January 4 – Deadline for comments from the community.

January 4–15 – Writing group and editorial committee incorporate comments.

January 15–22 – Final electronic version formatted by GEOPROSE.

January 22–27 – Writing group, editorial committee and ESSC proofread the final electronic version.

Januar 28–29 – GEOPROSE makes corrections

January 31 – Electronic version of the final report released followed by release of the printed version before the end of February. The report will be accompanied by an electronic supplement containing all submitted one–pagers.
